What is the type of admissions redesign?

Self-Reported Admissions: High school students enter limited academic information (e.g., GPA) into an online questionnaire/ portal to determine acceptance.

In which state is it based?

Alabama

What state postsecondary agency or system sponsors the program?

Alabama Possible is a nonprofit organization that is sponsoring the initiative. The Alabama Commission on Higher Education, the State Department of Education, and the Alabama Community College System are collaborating with Alabama Possible on this initiative.

When was the program first started?

Does the student or state agency/system initiate the admissions process?

Students must first complete a Match Profile.

What are the central characteristics of the program?

As part of Alabama Possible's "[Alabama Goes to College](#)" campaign, the Alabama Direct Admission Initiative allows all Alabama high school seniors to be admitted to participating in-state colleges and universities without a traditional application. High school seniors create a Match Profile and upload their academic transcript (with at least 3 years of grades). Institutions then review anonymous student profiles and make admission offers, which may include scholarship awards. The students select the offers of interest to receive admission materials. Students can accept as many offers as they wish, but students are not required to enroll in a school if they accept an offer.

Is opt-in required?</p>	<p>All high school seniors in Alabama who are residents of the state are eligible for the program, but they must complete the Match Profile. Match is an online platform managed by EAB. Opt-in is not required.</p>
	<p>Does the program support admission to four-year institutions, two-year institutions, or both?</p>	<p>Both four-year and two-year institutions participate.</p>
	<p>Which institutions are participating in the program?</p>	<p>For the 2025-26 academic year, four-year participating institutions include Alabama A&M University, Alabama State University, Athens State University, Auburn University at Montgomery, Faulkner University, Miles College, Spring Hill College, Stillman College, University of West Alabama, Troy University, Tuskegee University, University of Mobile, University of Montevallo, University of North Alabama, and University of South Alabama. Twenty-three community and technical colleges are also participating.</p>

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<p>Eligibility Criteria and Application</p>	<p>What are the academic eligibility criteria for students?</p>	<p>Criteria vary by institution.</p>
	<p>Are students still required to apply to postsecondary institutions?</p>	<p>No additional application is required.</p>
	<p>Is the application fee waived?</p>	<p>There are no application fees and no additional materials required, other than Match Profile completion and the student transcript.</p>
<p>Data and Policy</p>	<p>What is the data source for the program?</p>	<p>Students create a free Match profile and upload their transcript; transcripts are available to some students through PowerSchool or can be uploaded by the student's high school counselor.ⁱⁱ</p>
	<p>Did the state or system adopt policy related to the program, and if so what does the policy include?</p>	<p>No, it is an initiative of Alabama Possible, a nonprofit organization.</p>
