What are the central characteristics of the program?

The Michigan Assured Admission Pact (MAAP)'s eleven participating public universities are committed to: increasing awareness of high-quality educational opportunities, simplifying the admission process, and admitting all Michigan high school graduates who earned a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or above (4.0 scale).

Eligibility Criteria and Application 	What are the academic eligibility criteria for students?	Students are eligible if they have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or above based on a 4.0 scale. Additionally, the MAAP program applies only to students who are applying for admission for the first fall semester following their high school graduation. For institutions that evaluate the disciplinary and/or criminal history of applicants, these requirements are also in place. Students who complete some or all of their secondary education outside of the United States or at a non-English school may be required to demonstrate English proficiency in order to be admitted. Additionally, some of the universities grant admission to students with a GPA less than 3.0 for all or some of their programs.
	Are students still required to apply to postsecondary institutions?	Yes
	Is the application fee waived ?	Not as part of the MAAP program, but some of the universities do not have an application fee and those that do also may accept requests for fee waivers.
