My Texas Future is an online college and career advising portal in which students can be matched with colleges and universities based on academic information they provide; Texas residents can immediately see which institutions will accept them.

My Texas Future

Eligibility Criteria and Application 	What are the academic eligibility criteria for students?	Academic eligibility requirements vary by institution; participants are asked to enter as much of the requested information as they have, such as unweighted GPA (4.0 scale), class rank, entrance exams (SAT or ACT) scores, and their graduation plan.
	Are students still required to apply to postsecondary institutions?	Yes, students apply through the Apply Texas portal once they have determined which institutions might be a good fit.
	Is the application fee waived ?	Not through My Texas Future; some colleges and universities require an application fee, but students may be eligible for fee waivers if they cannot afford this application fee.
Data and Policy 	What is the data source for the program?	Participants must agree to share their profile with participating colleges and universities in Texas.
	Did the state or system adopt policy related to the program, and if so what does the policy include?	SB2314 (passed in May 2025) requires 1) high school students to choose whether to opt-in to the data sharing necessary for the application and admission component of My Texas Future, and 2) colleges and universities to link to My Texas Future from their admissions websites, and 3) school districts and charter schools to inform students and families about My Texas Future.
